Did you know???

As we all know the City of Russell's property taxes will be rising in 2026. We are all feeling the impact. However, did you know that there are property tax refunds out there?

There are two types of property tax refunds; the Regular Refund & the Special Refund.

The Regular Refund is based off of your income. If you make less than \$139,000, you qualify for the regular property tax refund.

With the Special Refund, if your property tax is increasing more than 12% and is raising your property taxes more than \$100 you are eligible for the Special Refund!

Talk to your tax accountant and/or go to the Department of Revenue website for more information.

Minnesota Memories December 2025...a memorable Christmas

On Christmas Eve, 1945 we gathered in my maternal grandparent's Florence, MN home. It was a uniquely memorable Christmas gathering because WWII was over and many of the boys who had been sent off to fight had come home. Three of those boys (certainly to be considered men at this point) were present at our little gathering, my mother's two brothers, Walter and Keith Wixon, and my father, Edward Burckhardt. They had all served in the Pacific Theater and returned unscathed. I was there as a four year old but truthfully do not remember this specific gathering. I "inherited" this memory during a conversation with another of my Wixon uncles, Kenneth (known to all of us as Barney for some reason unknown), who was a nine year old at the time. I asked him why he remembered this so vividly and he said, "Because I was there and your father threatened to shoot Santa Claus and all we kids were begging him not to do so." This rings true to me because I remember Dad making the same threat in subsequent Christmases...he did not want those reindeer messing up the roof. Fast forward many years and I made the same threat...obviously, neither my father nor I was serious, but it always added a little drama to Christmas Eve. So, what to make of this inherited memory story? First, if you have family elders, encourage them to share such memories. Second, if you are a family elder, share such memories with the youngsters. Shared family memories enrich the present and the future and speak to who we were, are and will be. Betty attended school in town. She liked algebra and home education while in high school. She took care of the younger children in her family, which kept her very busy. One special memory she had with her father was getting to help clean fish with him while the other kids did chores. On August 2, 1958, Betty married Dennis Battles. Following an unfortunate illness, Dennis passed away before their son, William "Bill" was born. Betty moved with her son to Marshall, Minnesota where she worked for Rowe Construction as a secretary.

Betty met Donald McConnell while at a roller rink in Balaton, Minnesota. They married on December 31, 1960 and made a life together on a farm near Ruthton, Minnesota. Betty was a homemaker and worked on the farm with Don while raising their five children. They retired in 2006. During their retirement, they enjoyed traveling across the country and spending winters in Texas. They also spent many years together working at the Marshall Avera Thrift Store. Don passed away in 2023. On Saturday, November 22, 2025, Betty passed away while at Prairie Home Hospice in Marshall at the age of 84 years, nine months and 29 days.

Betty was a member of Grace First Parish in Russell, Minnesota. She was part of a quilting circle which made baby hats for local hospitals, made backpacks for books, volunteered to help with church meals and fundraisers and many other church activities. She always kept busy on the farm taking care of the vegetable gardening, canning and tending to the flower gardens. She enjoyed traveling, card clubs, knitting, sewing, quilt making, playing scrabble, visiting with friends and spending time with her grandkids. She loved the cat Don brought home; Maxi became a very special companion after Don passed away.

Betty will be remembered for her kindness. She never said a bad word about anyone. She loved kids and enjoyed living in the country. She was very hard-working and devoted to the relationships she held with her friends and family.

Interment will be at the Russell Cemetery, followed by luncheon at the Russell Community Center. Visitation will be held one hour prior to his celebration, from 10:00 – 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, also at the church.

Vernon Albin Swanson was born on January 25, 1943, in Russell, Minnesota. He was the son of Albin and Sophie Swanson. Vernon grew up on the family farm near Russell and was baptized as an infant and confirmed in his youth at Grace Lutheran Church in Russell. He attended school in Russell before continuing to help his family on the farm.

On September 26, 1964, Vernon was united in marriage to Leigh Schuchard in Elkton, South Dakota. After meeting the love of his life at a local football game and the couple spent 56 years of marriage together prior to her death in 2019. They made their home on a hobby farm just outside Russell where they raised three children.

Vernon was proud of his hobby farm where he primarily raised and trained horses and later took on sheep. He drove truck for various places, namely over 30 years at Schwan's. Later he would serve as custodian for the Russell School and enjoyed his time as school bus driver in his home community.

Vernon's interests in life included hunting, fishing, time spent at their cabin on Nest Lake near Spicer, playing with his dog, and attending horse shows. In recent years Vernon could also be found trying his luck on video lottery games.

Vernon Swanson died on December 2, 2025, and Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He reached the age of 82 years, 10 months, and 7 days. Blessed be his memory.
